


2. Fiction Prompt: And Then...

You are going to continue the story by writing the middle and end. It would help if you brainstorm ideas first. You can talk them out with a family member first or create a web of ideas on a piece of paper. You need to think about using amazing describing words and using proper capitals and punctuation. Your story should make sense with the beginning prompt and should be well thought out. Use the lined template from your Work Portfolio and upload a photo or type it in on SeeSaw! Draw an illustration on the front and images from your story on the back!

The Estimation Jar




Login to SeeSaw to put in your estimation on Mrs. Goruk's estimation jar! On Friday I will announce the winner in the morning announcement on SeeSaw!


-Login to Brain Pop Jr (Lvlearners, Lakeview2020) and watch the video called "Rounding". Take the quizzes to test your knowledge!

Read the instructions on the Verifying Vegetables page and **CHOOSE EIGHT** (or more) questions from that page to complete and post on SeeSaw!




